IDENTITY THEFT



Pierce County Sheriff's detectives need your help to identify the suspect responsible for an identity theft.

At 6:15 a.m. on November 11th, 2016, an unidentified suspect stole a work van from a residence on 63rd Ave. Ct. E. in Puyallup. The van was found later that day, abandoned on 91st St. Ct. E. in Puyallup; over \$5000 worth of tools, an Iphone, an Ipad, the victim's wallet, credit cards, and identification were all missing from inside the van.

In February of 2017, the victim received a letter from the Cash America pawn shop in Mount Vernon indicating his stolen identification had been used by the pictured suspect to pawn items. Detectives determined the victim's identification had also been used at pawn shops in Tacoma and Federal Way.



The suspect appears to be a white male in his 20's, average height/weight, and wearing a Carharrrt beanie cap and a black Under Armour hoodie. The suspect was accompanied by an unidentified white male in his late 40's, average height/weight, and wearing a black jacket and a dark colored baseball hat. The men left the pawn shop in a dark 2-door vehicle driven by the younger male suspect.
